The Salvation Army in Abbotsford would like to say a big "thank you" to our amazing volunteers for all of their hard work throughout the year. This year, our volunteers have served almost 19,000 hours. Their tireless dedication supports our Meal Centre, Thrift Store, Drop-In Program, Shelter, Christmas Campaign and Emergency Services.

This summer saw one of the worst wildfire seasons in B.C. history. The Provincial government declared a "State of Emergency" as a record number of people were evacuated from their homes. In response, The Salvation Army opened its provincial disaster incident command centre in Abbotsford. Our volunteers travelled throughout B.C. and assisted the evacuees by welcoming them to the evacuation processing centres, preparing

and serving meals, and providing emotional support and spiritual care. More than 50,000 meals, 117,000 drinks and 89,000 snacks were given out, and over 10,000 evacuees received comfort from the Emotional and Spiritual Care teams.

It is the many hours of dedicated service by our volunteers that help The Salvation Army give hope to those in need. This would not be possible without the tremendous commitment and compassion of our volunteers, and the kind generosity of our donors. We would like to express our deep gratitude and appreciation. Thank you for all you do to support others, and to make Abbotsford a vibrant and caring community. May God bless you for being a blessing!
