



RECOVERY AFTER THE STORM NOVEMBER 2021

An Atmospheric River - a Community in Crisis



The local Salvation Army
Emergency Disaster Services
team mobilized immediately.
Working with Emergency
Social Services, and many
community partners to provide
three meals a day for the
evacuees at the Reception
Centre at Tradex for 6 weeks.



Fast forward to March 2022. Through the incredible generosity from donors locally, regionally, provincially and nationally, The Salvation Army – Abbotsford/Mission has disbursed \$200,000 in Flood Recovery Grants to assist local families and farmers who did not have insurance to cover the losses sustained during the flood. The assistance will impact 31 adults and 19 children, helping them to recover and start to rebuild.
