



A Spotlight on Hope Central & New Heights Church an outreach partnership with The Salvation Army's - Centre of Hope Meal Centre



In Mission, BC, Hope Central stands as a beacon of hope for those facing food insecurity and social isolation. Operating from Copper Hall in the Houghen Block, this grassroots ministry of New Heights Church has built something remarkable – a community where dignity, warmth, and nourishment come together.

Every week, Hope Central opens its doors to serve free breakfasts and dinners to anyone who needs them. Their regular dinner service runs Sunday, Tuesday, and Thursday evenings and breakfasts on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Meals are served by an incredible network of volunteers from local Rotary clubs, churches, schools, and community organizations. From Sunrise Rotary to All Saints Anglican Church, MEI to the Catholic Women's League, teams of five or more volunteers work together to prepare and serve meals with genuine care. They partner with The Salvation Army - Abbotsford/Mission who provide ready to serve meals for each dinner service.

But Hope Central is more than just food service. They've recognized a profound need within their community – when loved ones amongst the Hope Central guests pass away, which happens far too frequently, they struggle deeply with mourning and loss. In response, Hope Central has created a yearly memorial event to provide a safe and comforting space where people can process their grief together and remember friends who are gone. This compassionate initiative reflects their understanding that healing involves more than physical nourishment.

Hope Central has created a Services Hub that occurs during and following the Wednesday morning breakfast. Guests can meet with various service providers, while they eat or rest, and get crucial paperwork and other work done.

With growing demand stretching their resources, Hope Central relies on donations, grants, and volunteers to continue their vital work. They're proof that when a community comes together, hope isn't just possible – it's transformative.

Ministry Spotlight: The Next Step Program at The Centre of Hope

Our Second-Stage Housing Program is currently working through the Gospel of John in conjunction with the Celebrate Recovery curriculum. Program Manager Al Breitkruz and Chaplain Ross Hailes work with our 12 program participants on recovery principles, learning how to read the Bible, and how to work through life's many hurts, hangups and destructive habits.

Residents do group work, individual sessions, volunteer alongside the team at the Centre of Hope, learn life and employment skills, and commit to live alongside one another in community as they maintain their sobriety.

Residents attend Tuesday chapel services in our Shelter Common Room, and a group have even begun attending church together on a weekly basis.

We're excited to see their continued growth and development, and ask you to join us in praying for these participants and the program as a whole!

* This program is largely funded by your generous donations, alongside a minimal commitment by each resident.
